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P/C L. CHRIS BROWN TO BE INSTALLED AS DISTRICT COMMANDER AT D/5 SPRING CONFERENCE

This March, Delhigh's P/C Chris Brown, JN, becomes the Commander of District 5! District 5 is the largest district in USPS®. It contains 37 squadrons and engulfs the entire Chesapeake Bay. Chris's wife ,Ginny, is the one who was originally involved in D/5 as Assistant Secretary. While accompanying Ginny to District events, Chris got drawn into becoming more active in D/5.

Being a District Commander is a huge commitment of both personal time and money. It's a four year commitment to climb up the bridge ladder. You begin as Assistant Administrative Officer, move up to Administrative Officer, to Executive Officer, and finally to Commander. Each position is a one year term. Throughout your 4 year term you represent your fellow members at each of the national meetings and constantly attend District squadrons' functions, traveling as far south as Richmond, VA (we're the northernmost squadron) all on your time and at your own expense.

For those newer members who do not really know Chris, we'll give you a little background. His first exposure to boating was on a friend's sailboat in 1973 on the Chesapeake bay. He also boated with friends on Blue Marsh Lake and the Schuylkill River,.

Then, in 1979, he took the plunge and purchased a brand spankin new 22' cuddy. In a very short time, Chris and his 22 footer left the Schuylkill and Blue Marsh waters and began his long stint exploring the Chesapeake Bay. Think about it, a new boat, and a new boater, exploring the Chesapeake??? Scary, huh??? He's never owned up to the incident or incidents that finally drove him to take a public boating course put on by the Schuylkill River Power Squadron. Ten years later in 1990, after who knows how many untold additional incidents, he ran into a fellow worker at ATT, P/C Ron Gable, who convinced him to join Delhigh and further his boating education. He quickly got involved in Delhigh, taking many new courses and making many new friends. After one year, he took the job of treasurer and in 1995-96 became Delhigh's Commander.

There were other boats after the 22 footer, first to a 26 footer (that's still in Delhigh), then a 34' Sea Ray, and then Chris retired from work in 2003, and bought a 42' Carver and to this very day still explores the Chesapeake Bay (albeit a little wiser).

So, when you see Chris (soon to be D/C L. Chris Brown, JN), thank him for his dedication to Delhigh, District 5 and USPS, and congratulate him on his appointment! Better yet, on 27 March 2010, come to the Spring Conference and watch as Chris is installed as Commander of D/5!

Looking ahead to 2010, our squadron has accepted the responsibility to take on even more. And while our agenda seems full, I'm certain we can accomplish everything we tackle.

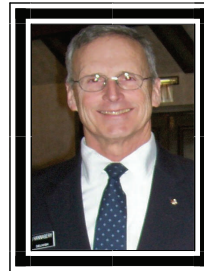
This year Delhigh will have three main objectives, all equally important to Delhigh reaching its full potential.

**Vessel Safety
Corner**

It is the time of year when everyone is getting cabin fever and looking forward to getting back on the water. This love of water and boating gives us a common bond. Now is the time to think about how we can prepare our boats for a Vessel Safety Check.

What is a Vessel Safety Check? VSC is a program to help boaters better understand and voluntarily come into compliance with the federal and individual state recreational boating safety regulations. Conducting a VSC by an examiner allows a one-on-one contact with the owner or operator, in hope that they will maintain and operate their vessel in a safe manner. It is also a time when boating education is introduced into the conversation, making the public more aware of the classes available to them to help increase their knowledge and on water boating skills, promoting safe boating and respect for the waterways on which we enjoy.

A Vessel Safety Check includes and is not limited to; checking Life Jackets, Visual Distress Signals, Fire Extinguishers, Ventilation, Back Flame Control, Navigation Lights, Sound Producing Devices and more.

Swinging the Lamp

Ahoy, again!

Illll'm baaaack! Bet you thought you'd heard the last of me... After all, it is winter and all our boats are likely put away; so what could I write about now?

Just because our boats are put away, we've got nothing to do? Poppycock! Alright, so the weather's been miserable of late. I mean it's been cold enough to freeze Can't say that here; it's a family publication. I mean, don't you have a life outside boating??? (Me neither.) Anyway, there's a lot to be done during these dreary, despondent months.

How about getting out that canvas you stuffed away in a box or a bag. Look at the zippers and snaps. Replace what's worn or broken now. Lubricate the zippers. Put a little zipper lube (or WD-40 works well) in all the female snaps. Check the seems. Threads wear out long before the canvas does. Fix them or get them fixed now. Canvas people are starved for work in the winter, so chances are you'll get it fixed right away, and I'll bet for a lot less than during the spring and summer rush. Don't wait until you're installing it to find out it needs repair.

How are their seems and zippers?

If you're close enough to your boat, now's a good time to look at your flares and other safety gear, so when vessel safety check time comes around, well, you're prepared. And last, but far from least, take a boating course!! Even if you're an SN, if it's been some time since you've taken courses, sit in on Piloting or Advanced Piloting. You'll be pleasantly surprised at how much they've changed; how much they relate to how we really boat today.

So, go ahead, get off that lard south of your belt, turn to and make these months fly by. Before you know it, you'll be back on the water. Remember,

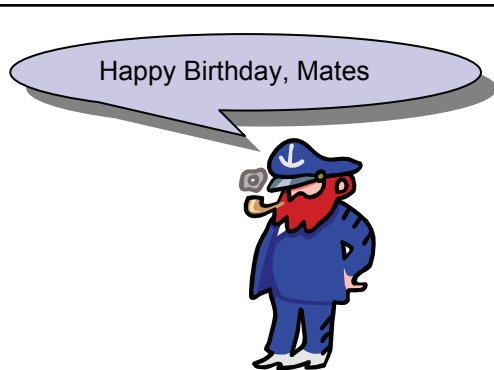

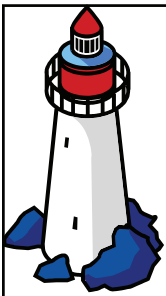

Boating Safety

Happy New Year to you all. Although many of us have boats in storage staying dry and covered, some like me, still venture out year round in the cold stuff. Whether your duck hunting, ice fishing, or just fishing on an open lake or bay, there are some extra precautions to take when dealing with just above freezing water. Falling into cold water will result in hypothermia, which is when core body temperature falls less than 95 degrees Fahrenheit. When cold water is involved, the scenario becomes much worse because wet victims lose body heat much faster than dry victims. Adding wind conditions will increase victims to lose heat very quickly as well.

Symptoms include:

- shivering
- exhaustion
- confusion
- slurred speech
- memory loss
- fatigue
- loss of motor control (fumbling hands)

FIRST AID FOR HYPOTHERMIA

TIME is of the essence

Get the person out of the water or weather as quickly as possible.

Replace wet clothing with dry. Wrap the person in blankets to warm them slowly.

Never give alcohol to a hypothermia victim.

Get medical help as soon as possible

Handle hypothermia victims gently and do not give anything by mouth if they are unconscious.

COLD WATER SURVIVAL

Wear a life jacket. If you know you are about to fall into cold water, cover your mouth and nose with your hands so you don't inhale water.

Do not remove your clothing.

Get back into or climb on top of the boat.

If you can't get out of the water and shore is too far, get into the Heat Escape Lessening Posture (HELP).



A few final notes. If you do plan to go enjoy a beautiful, cold day on or around the water, make sure you don't do it alone. Take a moment to discuss a plan with your partner for the "what if". It's easy to be prepared, too. Make sure you keep a compact reflective foil emergency blanket, dry clothing, communication means, high energy food bars, fire starter kit, and whatever else you can think of to match the level of risk you are embarking on. Keep it readily accessible and in dry packaging. Remember, if it is cold enough to cause hypothermia for the victim, its cold enough to cause hypothermia in the rescuers.
