The purpose of this exercise is to demonstrate proper technique to record and then reduce the sight for precise measurements attained from the Nautical Almanac for a "passing grade" accuracy of within 5 miles of a known location. I have complete confidence that by the end of this course we will all be closer to 1-mile accuracy






Executive Officers Report


Treasurer Report P/D/C Brian Becker, AP

According to the US Coast Guard "Each year hundreds of lives are lost... thousands are injured... and millions of dollars of property damage occurs because of preventable recreational boating accidents on U.S. waterways. Too often pleasure outings turn tragic. You — as a boat operator, passenger, or concerned individual — can make a difference. "Here is the US Coast Guard's Boating Safety WEB page.

Please take time to visit their WEB page. You will find some extremely useful information.

You can make a difference!! Please use this time of boating inactivity to sharpen your boating skills and knowledge. Take courses in boating safety, navigation etc... Talk to your boating friends and suggest they join the USPS and avail themselves to our advanced boating education courses. You could save their life. Your boat may not be in the water but it is a great time to think of boating safety. At the August National Governing Board event in Minneapolis, the District 10 Safety Officer handed out ESD Awareness Pamphlets warning of the Potential Shock Hazard near boatyard docks, piers and marinas where AC power is present. Each year people and their pets needlessly die due to this little discussed issue of faulty and leaking electrical equipment. Even if the stray current present is not strong enough to electrocute, it can and does paralyze the victim's muscles causing them to drown.

Reduce the Risk of Electric Shock Drowning

- Stay out of the water in the marina and elsewhere where AC powered equipment (boat lifts, etc.) is installed.
- Keep your family, guests, and pets out of such waters.
- Inform your family, guests and fellow boaters of the risk of electric shock drowning.
- Inspect your shore power cords and connections regularly.
- Engage a certified marine electrician to make repairs when experiencing wiring or equipment problems on your boat.

Electric Shock Drowning



You are a safe, skillful boater. You keep your vessel and its support equipment in tip-top operating condition.

You take all the required precautions against fire or explosion during and after refueling.

Despite all of this, you and your guests may not realize there may be another threat as you settle into another fun day on your boat while tied up in your transient or home slip.

The threat is electric shock drowning.

While your boat is in the slip, you may decide to jump off the swim platform to check out a prop that vibrated during the cruise. or recover

Electric Shock Drowning

occurs when an individual in the water encounters an electric field of sufficient strength. The victim is paralyzed by the electrical current, sinks below the surface, and drowns. In severe cases death can result from electrocution.

These electric fields in the water can be caused by an electrical problem on your own boat, on a nearby boat or boats, by devices such as a boat lift, or faulty dock wiring or equipment.

The amount of current required to kill a human or a pet is much less than that required to trip a circuit breaker.

The job of eliminating these dangerous conditions should be entrusted to a marine certified electrician.

Regardless, one should always stay out of the water where electrical equipment and wiring are present.

ESD Awareness Initiative

District 10 of the America's Boating Club[®] is conducting its Electric Shock Drowning (ESD) Awareness Initiative. The 11 clubs that comprise D/10 are visiting marinas in Minnesota, Wisconsin and part of Michigan's Upper Peninsula to spread ESD awareness and to promote installation of signs that warn the boating public of the danger.

The USPS Youth Poster Contest Awards promote youth appreciation and respect for recreational boating, and the message that safe boating is always fun boating.

The Contest is open to children ages 6–14, which is divided into three age groups:

1) Ages 6 – 8 2) Ages 9 – 11 3) Ages 12 – 14

Squadrons should conduct local contests and submit winning posters to their respective District for judging. Posters submitted to the National Membership Committee for judging must be endorsed by each District Poster/Membership Chair as the point of contact.

The 2018 Poster Theme:

"America's Boating Club Saves Lives"

Artwork should illustrate how safe boating through education, on the water skills, and proper use of equipment save lives.

Rules

- Each district may submit one poster in each age category.
- Each entry must be submitted on poster board or heavy construction paper; size 15"x20" or 14"x22"
- Entries must be judged at the district level to select winning entries for submission at the National contest level.
- Squadron and District judging deadlines are a local decision.
- Only District First-Place winners in each age category will be accepted for judging at the National level.
- Posters may be sketched lightly with pencil, but the result must be in color suitable for photography.
- <u>Professional illustrations, photos, copyrighted or trademark material, purchased or computer</u> <u>generated are not allowed and will disgualify the entry.</u>
- Posters must not to be folded.
- Posters will be judged on the Theme, message and artistic representation.
- Only one entry per person is allowed. All entries become the property of the United States Power Squadrons, which reserves the right to display and reproduce.
- Contest entry forms must be complete, legible, and attached to the back of their poster.
- <u>Annual Contest entries must now be delivered to the Fall Governing Board Meeting.</u> This year's meeting will be held in Minneapolis, MN. Posters must be received by Friday, 17 August 2018, for judging.
- First, Second and Third Place Winners will be announced for each age category during the Minneapolis Meeting. Awards are underwritten by a grant from the OMC Foundation.
