February is already here! This month brings us one step closer to getting back out on the water. I hope you are making plans for the upcoming boating season, and that those plans include activities with Annapolis Sail and Power Squadron. Although we always look forward to seeing you on the water, your help is also needed at a boat show. We're back at the Annapolis Sailboat Show on 24, 25 and 26 April. The boat shows are one of the ways that we promote

our organization. It's our chance to shine in our own community. We would love to have you there helping out! We'll be calling on our membership to work a shift or two in the booth.

Meanwhile, Maryland continues to work to make our state better. Our legislators have passed a bill that prohibits landfills from accepting compostable material – both yard waste and food – unless they can compost it themselves. If you take your leaves to a landfill as you are cleaning up for the spring, make sure they can compost the yard waste. Another change is that potable water and water from ice makers can now be diverted from your septic system. You can use that water for gardening or composting. On the horizon, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation will be promoting legislation to encourage investments in natural filters like trees and oysters. If you live on the water, you can do your part by planting trees and by volunteering to grow oysters at your dock.

Finally, I cannot resist reminding you again that we need members to help out on the Vessel Safety Check committee. P/C Kathy Nash, AP-IN does a wonderful job in coordinating this very useful service to our boating community. Becoming a volunteer is not really all that hard. It does not require experts on engines, electronics, or any other boat system. You will be taught everything you need to know. Once you qualify, you'll have the opportunity to see some beautiful vessels. Better still, you will have the opportunity to meet some great people – who might just be interested in joining Annapolis Sail and Power Squadron! Take a break from Utility! For February? What Else? The True Lover's Knot AKA Jury-Mast-Knot


Now, it's just considered decorative. But, in the days of wooden sailing ships it was used as a utility knot.







ASPS Website: Recent Revisions

Over the last six weeks, the Annapolis Sail and Power Squadrons website (<u>www.aspsmd.org</u>) has received major revisions and updates. The look, content, and functionality were significantly modified. The current version of the website has little in common with the previous version.

The initial catalyst for this effort was in response to notification received in mid-October from the USPS Communications Committee stating that our

website was not in compliance with USPS standards for squadrons. Therefore, ASPS would not be eligible for the Distinctive Communicator Award (DCA) issued for websites. ASPS had received the DCA award many times in the past for its website. As standards were revised, our website wasn't. The Communications Committee's 2019 Website Evaluation Form for ASPS noted many non-compliant issues, which included:

- ♦ No America's Boating Club logo on each page
- ♦ Use of retired logos and taglines
- ♦ Photos of Bridge Officers
- ◆ Link to SailAngle webpage with logo
- ♦ Link to America's Boating Club webpage
- Short text description of Photos
- Explanation of Merit Marks
- ♦ Link to Boat Live 365 webpage with logo
- ◆ The text "America's Boating Club® is a trademark of the United States Power Squadrons®"

The initial changes to our website addressed these issues. Then we asked for a re-evaluation by the Communications Committee. We were informed that the changes made to our website brought it back into compliance (at least until the standards are revised again) and the Committee had recommended our website for the DCA. Although it may be too late to receive it for 2019, as submissions were due in October.

Once compliance issues were resolved, the second phase of website revisions and updates were started. The goal was to add and enhance features and provide additional information to the user. This was the fun part, which allowed me to be creative. Changes made included:

♦ Rework of the Navigation Bar for ease of readability and function. Additional direct links were added for pages that had been embedded elsewhere on the website and hard to find. For aesthetics, a larger and clearer photo of Thomas Point Lighthouse was added. To avoid any possible copyright issues, the photo used was taken by Kathy Nash while cruising the South River on her 17ft Boston Whaler. (Good job Kathy)

• Many additional "Quick Links" were added via graphic logos for America's Boating Club, USPS, Social Media sites, and boating safety information. The bottom of the Boating Safety webpage is a good example of this feature.

◆ The Ship's Store webpage now appears as a direct selection item from the Navigation Bar. The Ship's Store webpage has been enhanced with "Quick Links" to product sample items.

• Detailed information about Vessel Safety Checks and why a boat owner should pursue one has been added to the VSC webpage.

• The Anchor Watch webpage has been completely redesigned to provide users with easier access to current and past editions of the Anchor Watch. Direct access to five plus years of past editions has been provided. A weblink to the Ensign, official magazine of America's Boating Club, has been added.

♦ The Photos webpage now provides links to squadron Meetings and Events photographs compiled from Anchor Watch publications going back through 2016. This provides photos with the names of members. It's also an excellent way to review the squadron activities for the past several years.


♦ A new webpage named "Contact Information" has been added to the website. This page summarizes mechanisms for contacting Squadron Officers and Administrators, as well as various other common requirements for communication with the squadron. These include registering for Courses and Seminars, requesting a Vessel Safety Check, inquiring about Membership, and making Dinner Meeting Reservations. This should provide website users a superior way to contact the squadron without searching multiple pages on our website.


• Another webpage completely redesigned is the "Links" page. The goal was to enhance this page as a resource for safety, operational, regulatory, and medical information for our membership and the public. We hope it becomes a "go to" source for such needs. The amount of links provided has increased from less than a dozen to over fifty. More links will be added as they become identified.

• For security reasons, all personal email addresses were deleted from the website and replace by generic aspsmd.org email addresses.

There were additional enhancements added to every webpage. I can't list them all here. I encourage you to review the new website yourself and let me know your impressions. In closing, I would like to thank the Squadron's leadership for the opportunity (and their trust in me) to accomplish this task. I enjoyed doing it and learned a lot in the process, including much about HTML coding.



New Course: Radar for Boaters P/C John Wesley Nash, SN-IN

ASPS Instructor, Webmaster & Port Captain

Starting at 7:00 pm on Tuesday, 17 March 2020 in Annapolis High School, ASPS will be offering the course "**Radar for Boaters**". The two-hour classes will run for five consecutive weeks. This is a new USPS course being offered for the first time by ASPS. The course will cost \$75.00 and includes the latest edition (book and addendum) of "The Radar Book". (https://bit.ly/2ugSGcg)

I'm looking forward to being your instructor for this course. Both Kathy and I took this course last spring when it was offered by Kent Narrows Sail and Power Squadron. We found it to be an excellent course. Even though I'm very knowledgeable about marine radars, I learned a lot from this course.

Marine radars have been available for many years. In many ways, their principles, technologies, and general configuration hasn't changed much over the years. They have always been considered an essential requirement for effective navigation, blind piloting, and collision avoidance. Many boaters and professional mariners wouldn't consider leaving the dock at night or in challenging weather conditions without a functioning radar system onboard. I can assure you from personal experience, having a good marine radar and the knowledge to operate it properly has gotten me through many challenging voyages on the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries. (A side benefit to attending this course: you get to hear my stories.)

Over the last few years, the options for technology, installation, and integration of radar into the electronic navigation systems of recreational boats has changed greatly. It's not your father's radar system anymore. Advancements in solid-state technology have made HD radars, Broadband radars, and even Doppler radar technologies realistic options for the recreational boating market. Integrating, and knowing how to properly use these new technologies is essential for maximizing collision avoidance and situation awareness. This includes integrating AIS, MARPA, and radar overlay onto your electronic charts on MFDs. (Multi-Function Displays) Those are some of the subjects this course will cover. Here are some of the others:

- ◆ The Basics and History of Radar
- ♦ Controlling & Interpreting the Display
- ◆ Navigation & Blind Piloting Using Radar
- ♦ Heavy Weather & Obstruction Avoidance
- ♦ How and Why Radar Works

- ♦ Interfacing & Integrating Radar Systems


