From Bustleton Pike (Rt 532) and Street Rd. Feastervile, PA Take Bustleton Pike N past The Buck Hotel. Bear Right to Bridgetown Pike. Continue past Playwiki Farm to the Roundabout. BACON WRAPPED CHICKEN THIGHS



Ingredients

1 tube (8 ounces) refrigerated crescent rolls 1 small apple, peeled and cut into 24 thin slices 6 thin slices Gouda cheese, quartered 24 miniature smoked sausages Honey mustard salad dressing, optional

Directions

Preheat oven to 375°.

Unroll crescent dough and separate into 8 triangles; cut each lengthwise into 3 thin triangles.

On the wide end of each triangle, place 1 slice apple, 1 folded piece cheese and 1 sausage; roll up tightly.

Place 1 in. apart on parchment-lined <u>baking sheets</u>, point side down. Bake until golden brown, 10-12 minutes. If desired, serve with dressing.
