

VSC Corner



The boating season is upon us, and we all are excited to get on the water.

Before we do, let's slow down and check to be sure everything is in proper working condition. For those who trailer, check your trailer tires for proper inflation and to see that they are not dry rotted, which could cause a tire to blow out while traveling down the road. Also, check lug nuts on trailer tires to be sure they are not loose. Check to be sure that the axle bearings have enough grease to avoid failure. Check springs for cracks and to see that shackle bolts are tight; not worn and rusted away. Check lights and wires for cracked insulation and for good connections. Lightly grease the trailer ball so that your trailer tracks straight.

Inspect your life jackets for tears, worn straps and buckles, and to see that the USCG label is not faded, but able to be read. Inflatable life iackets should be inflated to test for leaks. Throw cushion materials will break down from sunlight, so give them a once-over to see that they have remained in good condition. Check expiration dates on flares as well as the batteries in flashlights and radios.

Thank you to all who attended the Beltzville Lake Cleanup and Vessel Safety Checks on May 20.

Let's all have a great summer and enjoy the time out on our boats. Remember to always be aware of what is going on around you. Be safe and have fun.

America's Boating Channel[™] Promoting National Safe Boating Week May 20-26, 2023

Recreational boating and water activities are enjoyed by millions of Americans each year. Boating safety advocates recommend all boaters and passengers have a life jacket and always wear it while boating. Regardless of your age or experience level, the data shows that life jackets save lives.

But a life jacket can only save your life if it's used correctly. Always keep life jackets clean and neatly stowed when not in use. Proper care of life jackets ensures that they'll work when



they're needed and extends their useful life. Plus, fresh clean life jackets are more attractive to wear and desirable for people to use while underway on your boat.



In-the-water buoyancy testing should be conducted at the beginning of every season. Foam deteriorates over time, so test to ensure that your life jacket keeps your mouth out of the water. A serviceable life jacket should keep you afloat for several hours, with all hardware and straps firmly attached and in working order.

Videos are available that offer an overview of the importance of wearing and caring for your life jacket. America's Boating Channel produced these videos to help viewers learn it only makes sense to treat your life jacket as though your life depends on it.

Watching videos like <u>"Life Jacket Care"</u> (<u>https://youtu.be/</u> <u>iEofd6mUwN4</u>) is an excellent way

to understand how to properly care for your life jacket. America's Boat-

ing Channel also produced a sequel entitled <u>"Life Jacket Wear"</u> (https://youtu.be/FgFLNGIbFxo). It shows how recreational boaters can ensure serviceability and extend the useful life of life jackets. Viewers also learn about special considerations for inflatable and foam-filled jackets. Also featured are tips regarding life jacket replacement. You can follow the above links or visit https://www.youtube.com/@AmericasBoatingChannel to find these and other safe boating videos, which are an excellent tool to help recruit participants to our educational program and to membership. THE UNCOMPROMISING "STAND-ON" VESSEL (NOT SO FAST)



Maritime law identifies vessels as "stand-on" or "give-way"

The definition from the USCG Navigation Rules, Rule 17 Action by Stand-On Vessel states: "Where one of two vessels is to keep out of the way, the other shall keep her course and speed."

In addition the rule states: "When, from any cause, the vessel required to keep her course and speed finds herself so close that collision cannot be avoided by the action of the give-way vessel alone, she shall take such action as will best aid to avoid collision."

Rule 5 states that :"Every vessel shall at all times maintain a proper look-out by sight and hearing as well as by all available means appropriate......to make a full appraisal of the situation and of the risk of collision"

The Boat Virginia safe boating course defines the "Stand-on" vessel as the vessel that must keep the same speed and course, unless the give-way vessel does not take action." Same confirming message.

SO, NOW FOR THE REAL WORLD SITUATION

Some boaters, power and sail, believe that if they are the "stand-on" vessel, everyone needs to stay out of their path, even if they are turning. Furthermore many mariners are casual about keeping a good look-out. All boaters are responsible for preventing collisions, and most collisions are avoidable. Even the "stand-on vessel" may be responsible for damage if there is no effort to avoid the collision.

Wind conditions and wind shifts can make it challenging for a sail boat to hold course as defined by the rule. Regardless, the sail powered boat (stand-on vessel) must provide a "give–way" vessel room when the "give-way" vessel is attempting to keep clear.

Suppose a sailboat is maneuvering up wind and approaching a powerboat heading toward her. The powerboat is the "give-way" vessel and is attempting to keep clear. The sailboat ("stand-on vessel") may not tack (altering course) in front of the oncoming powerboat so that a risk of collision now exists. Any such maneuver should be initiated with adequate time for the give-way vessel to alter course safely.

In conclusion, every vessel operator must recognize the shared responsibility to avoid collisions and always maintain a vision of surrounding vessels that might have crossing or head-on paths. Wind conditions and limits of visibility can have a bearing on adequate safe boating requiring extra caution. "Maintaining course" means a straight line course.






