

Sad tidings, shipmates. The passing of P/C Brooks Riley has created an enormous void in the heart of the Squadron. Jeanne and I went to see him at Gilchrist Hospice, and I am very sad that it was the last time we will see him. He was an amazing man.

I met Brooks years before joining the Squadron, back in the '90s when I had an old '82 Toyota Corona (the last year for that breed, they went to the Camry in '83, looked identical but had front wheel drive), and often needed both parts and advice. Brooks was dishing out both up at Hunt Valley Toyota, and I came to rely on him while I owned that car. In 2003 I finally got something else, but kept his business card. Imagine my shock when we joined the Squadron, and there he was! I remembered his smiling face, imposing frame, and bald head. It made a good impression on me about the Squadron, if someone like him was in it!

Like me, we all came to rely on Brooks - his thoughtfulness, generosity, incredible memory, and caring nature. He will be hugely missed.

<u>Weather:</u> To spy on our competition, I took the 2-hour Weather seminar offered by the Annapolis SPS. It was very good, a great refresher for me (I had some meteorology in college, and have taught the Squadron's 8-week weather course twice now, which made me re-learn a lot). The SEO has me set up to teach the seminar one night down at the Maryland Yacht Club one night, I think in July, if you have any interest, and I will try to do as well as Annapolis did.

<u>Communications:</u> I also took the marine radio seminar that Annapolis offered two nights later. This is because when our radio announces that someone is calling us, I get tongue-tied, scream "AAAGH! Someone is on the radio! Here!!", and throw it to Jeannie. I thought maybe that a little education would make me feel more confident when I have to call for help. It was a really good course, I got a lot out of it, and will be practicing (NOT on the air).

<u>S/V Certainty</u>: Our baby is out from under the tarps at Maryland Marina - we painted the hull with anti-fouling (except where she sits on the trailer bunks – I ran out of time to lift her), the mast is stepped, she's washed and waxed, the outboard is de-winterized and tested, and the batteries are charged up. We took Uncertainty – that's our leaky inflatable – over to Parkside Marina, where she lives in season, and got the slip lines up, so we can dock more easily (read that as "don't go careening into the adjacent slips while backing"). Still gotta do a few little things tighten screws, grease this and that, etc. - but hopefully she'll splash in a couple of days, and become the Terror of Frogmortar Creek once more. (Also, we still need to check the flares and whatnot, so we don't flunk our VSC, but that'll happen this week too). She should be afloat by the time you read this, yay! Our summer cottage on the water! (Well, she's so little that it's more like camping in a pup tent with the added advantage of possibly drowning, but she's fun!)



FIVE PLANETS ALIGN WITH THE CRESCENT MOON ON JUNE 24, 2022



This month offers a rare opportunity to view all five planets visible to the naked eye at one time. The best viewing opportunity will be pre-dawn on June 24th. The arc of planets along the ecliptic will be visible to the east and southeast. Mercury is closest to the eastern horizon, followed by Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn as the arc moves toward the south. The new crescent moon will also be aligned with the ecliptic, between Venus and Mars.

For our area, sunrise is at 0540 EDT, and it is recommended that the best viewing is 45 minutes before dawn. That means getting up EARLY, even by 4:30 am to get oriented and be sure your eyes are acclimated to the dark. Start out by looking for the easiest to spot objects, which will likely be Jupiter and the crescent moon. Once you spot these, you can mentally construct the arc of the ecliptic which makes it easier to spot the others. While Venus is bright, it is relatively low in the sky, so may be harder to find. At 0455, Venus' altitude is 12 degrees above the horizon. Mercury is about 5 degrees altitude and slightly to the left of Venus.

You will definitely need a clear view of the ENE horizon to spot Mercury. It is very close to the horizon and the lowest magnitude of the visible planets, so you might use binoculars to scope it out. It's a battle of time, as Mercury is rising just before the sun. You are hoping it gets high enough to spot before the sky gets too bright.

This grouping will be viewable through June, but June 24 is recommended as the best option with Mercury at highest before the dawn sky gets too bright. The above graphic is from the Sky and Telescope website. The moon location will shift from night to night.
