

Safety Officer's Corner

Safe operation is our first concern when we are on or near the water

As enjoyable as the waterfront and the maritime environment are, there are some significant dangers that are always with us. With proper equipment, mainte-

nance, and training the risks are manageable and acceptable. After five decades of hanging around ships and boats and marinas, a few lessons have really stood out to me. There are two key concepts on safety that I would like to share with you.

Number one: Nearly all accidents are chains of events that lead up to the incident and the resultant damage or failure or injury or death. Break the chain of events and the accident doesn't happen or is less severe than it could have been. The accident precursor chain can be broken in many ways. A crew member or passenger might ask a question that prompts you to check on a system or the source of a noise or a smell. You see another boat doing something and it prompts you to look at your boat to make sure you are not committing the same error. Your assessment of the trip changes because the weather gets worse, you realize that you are fatigued or the situation is exceeding your ability, or a passenger is not feeling well. The boat doesn't "feel right." Your



inner gut alarm is going off. Anything that causes you to check what you are doing and make sure it is still safe can break an accident chain.



Number two: The most critical decision you make all day is to go or not go. There are many things leading you towards going—don't want to disappoint your guests, it is your only day free for a while, you want to play with your pride and joy, beautiful weather, and so on. If you are not feeling well, the boat is not mechanically sound, weather forecast is not good, and other factors are negatives in your assessment of whether it is a good choice to go. If the factors add up to no go, then it is the captain's responsibility to not embark on the voyage. Not going can prevent sailing into much more hazardous circumstances that could really ruin your day. The best form of seamanship is to not get

into situations where you need to exercise your emergency training.

Stay safe out there


