Commander's Message

D/C Robert S. Blevins, AP

The Winter season is here and have you winterized your boat? I'm almost finished with mine. This last year was a good one. We enjoyed a great Summer Council and Rendezvous hosted by Patuxent River Sail and Power Squadron, a fantastic Fall Conference in Linthicum, Md. hosted by Dundalk Sail and Power Squadron with lots of squadrons and members receiving educational awards.

The new National iMIS system was launched to facilitate all of the District and Squadron records at your fingertips. It has growing pains as any new system will, but National is working through them as members report them. We have our own P/D/C Joe Gibson, AP who has volunteered to be our local expert on iMIS and he has conducted classes on how to maneuver the system at the Fall Conference. If you have concerns, please contact Joe for help.

National has also launched a new system called Marine SEO to support squadrons in gaining membership. Marine SEO's main push is to make all squadron Facebook front pages look similar in nature, so when a outsider calls up USPS, it will auto link that person to local squadrons within 100 or so miles. They will also help you update your Facebook pages if desired and offer grants for you to advertise local/regional events. This is a volunteer program to all squadrons, but those squadrons that have signed up for Marine SEO help have seen an increase in visibility and membership. Our District Executive Officer Bill Hammett, JN is the person who can put you in touch with Marine SEO for them to work with you and your Facebook page(s).

Three months ago USPS[®] National informed all districts and squadrons that the National insurance policy have been cancelled as of I Dec 2024 for all squadrons and district events. On 30 Nov 2024, National informed all districts and squadrons that they have acquired a new insurance policy to replicate the one cancelled for all districts and squadrons starting 1 December 2024. This policy also includes on-the-water training, VSE/VSCs and other on-the-water events. The on-the-water part is presently being written with the carrier and will be available in January 2025. As per the Chief Commander's letter in August many squadrons have acquired their own insurance for D&O and casualty. These individual squadron policies are the squadron's responsibility to decide to cancel or retain depending on the coverage desired. However, the new National policy will cover D&O and casualty as before. More on the new policy shortly.



America's Boating Club | United States Power Squadrons held its Fall Governing Board in Pittsburgh from 24-28 September 2024. A good time was had by all at the Friends' Night with the attendees answering the history questions based on the Billy Joel song, "We didn't Start the Fire." It really developed into a very competitive situation with the members thinking back to our younger years.

Thursday was an excellent meeting with District Commanders and District Executive Officers sharing information with each other. At this meeting, Yvonne Hill, Headquarters Staff, briefed the attendees on our new management system iMIS which allowed "hands-on" participation. This enhanced the learning process for this system. Marine SEO, a marketing company, also made a presentation in a seminar which was well received. They are using Facebook and Google, which could allow up to \$10,000 of Google advertising if the squadron wanted to participate in the program. Many squadrons opted to allow changes to their Facebook account and this would have continuity of the brand which would allow easier access when someone is searching for our organization.

On Saturday's business meeting, it was discussed our present insurance company was cancelling our policy as of 30 November 2024. This was the result of a significant payout by the company. Districts and Squadrons were advised to seek insurance just in case National could not find another carrier. Chubb insurance just cancelled our coverage and it had nothing to do with the premium; however, we have secured a new insurance policy which will cover the District/Squadron Officers, events directly connected to our mission; and within the month, we will have coverage for the on-the-water activities. More information will be forthcoming from the National Headquarters.

Saturday night was great fun with the attendees dressed as if they were getting their boats ready for the season. There were some different types of outfits, but all in all everyone had a great time.

Please make plans to attend the Annual Meeting at the Rosen Plaza, Orlando, Florida and greet friends and make new ones. The learning experience is always better in a face-to-face situation and it is a "load" of fun. See you there.


